Message from the General Manager Ruben Crane



Board of Director Elections — The election results are in and the winners of this years LAPRAAC Board of Director Elections were Kathy Meek, Martee Miyakawa, Vic Su'apa'ia and Ruben Holguin. Also, all three ballot measures were approved and have been put into effect. In brief there were three measures approved. The first allows for a recruit from an outside agency who completes their training through the LAPD Academy to be eligible to participate in the intra-departmental sports program and to have access to the facilities. The second and third measure focused on who is eligible to be a LAPRAAC Director and reduced conflict of interest of Board of Directors serving on multiple Boards. We thank you for your participation in this year's election. In addition, at the last Board of Directors Meeting, they also voted to establish this year's Officers of the Board.

Capital Improvements and Fiscal Adjustments — Over the past decade the LAPRAAC Board has continued to focus on the membership. Before the renovations started we had already upgraded the weight room, the audio visual system in the lounge, re-roofed the pool house and the combat range, we replaced all the A/C units in the lounge and café (no small task, it requires a helicopter to drop them on the roof) and numerous other projects. In addition, we continued to maintain the academy grounds with limited City support. All this in addition to the robust sports program we offer to our athletes. In the background however, we continued to take on a bigger task, negotiating a \$40 Million renovation of the academy. As we have reported on numerous times in the past, that agreement was accomplished and the renovation project moved forward.

Once the renovation project started, we became very aware that there was still much more to do that did not fall into the City's scope of work. As a result, your Board of Directors moved to enhance our facilities in many of those areas, some of which we are still in negotiations with the City for reimbursement. But even in areas that we feel the City should have taken the lead, we felt it better for the membership if we provided the capital improvement now, and go back to the City and seek reimbursement later, than to open a renovated academy that fell so short it would not be a benefit for the membership. So let's take a quick look at some of the capital projects that have been and are currently being undertaken as part of our dedication to the membership.

- 1. The pool house has recently been reopened after needing a complete redo of the plumbing and electrical system. It also has new fixtures, lockers, lighting and other touch up items.
- 2. The men's locker room has all new lockers.
- 3. We are currently installing a state of the art A/V system in the lounge.
- 4. Audio system in the café.
- 5. New TV's in the café.
- 6. Weight room upgrade with new flooring and equipment.
- Functional Dumbwaiter. This one is behind the scenes, but it supports the catering operation to enhance your events while minimizing risk to staff.
- 8. Re-upholstery of the café seats.
- 9. New counters in the café.
- 10. Re-plumb shower drains in the men's locker room.

And this just covers some of the renovations topping out over \$300,000. But we are not just looking back, we are also looking forward, we have are eye focused on continually improving our operations as well. We continue to bring new items and new sales to the stores as well. Not to mention we have increased the hours of operation at LAPRAAC West for those on that side of town. It also does not stop there, have you participated in any of our events lately? If you have you will notice the tried and true events like Memorial Run, Top Gun and the Bench press contest, but did you take advantage of our Equipment Expo Day? Those who attended were treated to an experience like no other in the firearms industry. We had over 30 vendors on hand to interact with, but maybe the best part was the live fire portion. What is live fire you ask? All the major firearms manufacturers were on site at our ranges with multiple firearms from each in which you were allowed to take your turn shooting and asking questions. We even had full auto firearms! Thos who participated were so excited they were asking about the next time we would have this before they even left the event. Are you competing in the World Games? LAPRAAC has over 50 budgeted teams. The Board of Directors has authorized a total sports budget just over \$400,000 to maximize your participation in the sports program and the games. They have even allowed for a case by case basis of individuals not on a team to participate and receive some reimbursement. So get out there and compete.

As we continue to look forward, we also have to accept the fact that to maintain the academy and continue growing our program will come with a price. That price is moderately offset by our retail operation. But to keep our pricing competitive and to continue to offer great sales days in the stores, it does require more. Raising dues is never an easy decision and is never taken lightly or done on a whim. Careful and exhaustive thought is put behind even considering a change. In fact, it has been just over nine years since the last increase because of the excellent fiscal management taken on by your Club. But with the ever increasing costs of operations and maintenance we will be making a slight adjustment to the dues deduction of one dollar and fifty cents. If you spread that out over the past nine years that means it would only be an increase of about thirty three cents a year, significantly less that the increases that your Club has had to absorb. We hope you will understand and see how your Board is continuing to enhance your Club, its programs and facilities. We thank you for your continued membership and look forward to a better future.

Around 400AD, Saint Augustine coined the phrase, "The greatest evil is physical pain." Whether or not that is true, what is true is the powerful connection between our mind and body. Regardless if you are an expectant mother with the mental fortitude to have pushed past pain during delivery or someone overcoming the pain endured due to illness or injury, our state of mind plays a major role in our perception of pain.

Leknes and Bastian (2014) demonstrated in Review of Philosophy and Psychology that pain can enhance our perceived value of certain activities. One example is when we are working towards a fitness goal. Yes, it is challenging to push ourselves past what we think our body can endure, but when we do, the noticeable benefits can be highly rewarding. Outside of our personal experiences, pain can illicit prosocial behaviors like building/gathering our social support system.

Traditionally, one thinks of pain as something negative. Whether it is dull or sharp, chronic or acute, physical pain is an unpleasant experience. Yet it is our body's way of telling us that something is wrong. Left unattended, it can sap our energy, rob us of restorative sleep and decrease our frustration tolerance. Pain can put us in a bad mood, very quickly. Yet, once we let pain overwhelm our mental and emotional capacities, its physical manifestation becomes worse.

Fortunately, the connection from mind to body is not a one-way street. If we can tap into our resources (i.e., social support, hobbies, exercise, healthy diet), we can change our experience of pain. Meaning, we have the power to control it because it is a tool our body uses to let us know we need to adjust something in our life. It is not evil but a (hopefully) temporary, unpleasant experience that we learn to manage. This is not to say we can will pain away, but rather our state of mind dictates our relationship with pain. With a positive outlook on life, our experience of pain won't be as unpleasant. Therefore, our overall quality of life can be improved as we keep engaged in the people and activities that we cherish.




