LAPRAAC is located at the Los Angeles Police Academy in Elysian Park and is full of Los Angeles Police Department history. It is the social outlet and fitness arm of the LAPD. LAPRAAC is governed by a board of directors comprised of sworn police officers elected by the membership.

LAPRAAC operates the LAPRAAC stores (Westchester and Elysian Park) including the gift shop, gun shop and uniform shop. We also operate our café and catering service as well as the rock garden and lounge. Our athletic and recreational workout facilities are available 24 hours a day and include: weight room, swimming pool, locker rooms and showers, steam bath, racquetball and handball courts gymnasium and athletic field. LAPRAAC participates in 52 different sports throughout the year including the annual United States Police & Fire Championships and the bi-yearly World Police & Fire Games and sponsors two major annual athletic events: Baker to Vegas challenge cup relay and the police memorial relay race.

A message from the President Rick Santos

Happy New Year! Yes, it is August but for LAPRAAC, summer marks the beginning of the new fiscal year and a new LAPRAAC Board of Directors. The election results are in and we have two new members joining our team- Bryan Dameworth and Lilly Vizcarra. Both are from Metropolitan Division and bring new ideas and excitement to the Board of Directors. Remaining on the Board will be Ruben Gonzalez (Vice President), Kathy Meek (Treasurer), Ivan Ramos (Secretary), Ruben Holguin, Martee Miyakawa, Vic Su'apa'ia, Chris Yamate and Tim Colomey. As we welcome two new members we also say good bye and thank you to Jeff Bert and Raymond Maltez. Jeff and Ray, your dedication and hard work set the standard for current and future Board Members. Your hard work and dedication are truly appreciated. As you move on to other challenges we all wish you Godspeed.

I am humbled by the opportunity to serve the membership as your President for this upcoming year. I am committed to you, the members, to do what is best, and uphold the traditions of our institution. To all members, I am committed to listening to any and all feedback, ideas, and suggestions. On behalf of the Board, we are re dedicated to the success and wellness of our members.

Although we are right in the middle of summer, fall is right around the corner, and September is National Suicide Prevention Awareness Month. This is a tough topic to discuss because we are all impacted by officer suicide. Most of us choose to avoid discussing this topic as to not shine a negative light on an Officer who took his or her life.

We have always been taught the importance of taking care of ourselves during violent encounters. We were all taught about the 1%, who would not hesitate to kill us if we gave them the opportunity. However, nationwide data show that a Police Officer is more likely to die at his or her own hands than by the hands of a suspect. In 2018 there were 167 police officers nationwide who took their own life compared to 145 who died in the line of duty. To date we have had 106 Officer's die by their own hands (bluehelp.org) compared to 66 line of duty deaths (Officer Down Memorial Page). These line of duty deaths include killed by suspect, traffic collision, heart attack and other means.

Research completed by Dr. John Violanti (Department of Epidemiology and Environmental Health, University of Buffalo) indicates that officers are at a 69% higher risk of committing suicide than the public at large. No doubt officers are exposed to more trauma than most people. The public does not call us when things are going well. Our calls for service will at times take us to horrific and tragic scenes. How many times have you seen a victim's dead body? Or the body of a deceased child? Or a horrific traffic collision? Officers from around the world experience death and tragedy at a rate that is unnatural. And those exposures take their toll, even if you don't recognize it. Shift-work, lack of sleep, overtime, mandated court appearances all compound to wear down your physical, mental, and emotional well-being.

We should not be uncomfortable talking about something that is literally killing us! We must also start taking better care of one another. Finding healthy outlets to deal with the demands of the profession is essential. We all chose this profession to make a difference in the lives of others, and answer the call for help. Let's make sure we also look out for each other so that we can continue to respond to those calls. Remember, the Department provides peer counselors Behavioral Sciences Section. We also have Managed Health Network (MHN) which gives all sworn employees and their families 12 counseling sessions annually.

LAPRAAC is also another great resource. We were committed to not only build camaraderie, but to build a healthy officer. Staying fit and participating in activities is a great way to keep yourself ready for the demands of the job. LAPRAAC offers several different sports and activities for all of our membership. We have men's and women's softball, baseball, football, powerlifting, CrossFit, triathlon, fitness team, Corn-Hole, women's football and many others. If we don't have your activity come talk to the LAPRAAC Athletic Dept.

It all comes down to this – please take care of yourself and one another. And let us know how we can help.

Competitors start with a one-mile run then shoot 12 rounds, run one mile, shoot 12 rounds and complete the event by running the final mile. Time penalties are added to competitors overall time for each missed shot out of the scoring target strip.


